LaVahn Hoh: Part two with Nancy.

Nancy Davies: So I said to the regional publicist ... I said, "Huh, I wonder if they would let us take [Beau 00:00:11] next door and stroll him through the Krispy Kreme drive-through" Because I'm thinking of the visual. She looked and she goes, "I don't know. I'll ask." And they did. We set this all up with media. We had eight media outlets there, like four TV stations, newspapers, and such. Larry brings out Beau, and we had arranged that there were going to be ... They had three dozen donuts. We get the shot. Larry's going to feed Beau. And we're done. So we have all this media there. Larry comes out, strolls up to the drive-through, first dozen come out. They've already pre-made these. Beau eats them. Second dozen, Beau eats them.

Nancy Davies: And we're really kind of done at this point. But third, okay, Beau eats them. Larry wasn't done, though. Larry decided he was going to keep feeding, so they need to give the hot donuts that were coming off the line. So another dozen. And I have no control at this point. Neither does the regional publicist. We are at Larry's mercy. And I looked at her, and I said, "I really don't need any more. They've got the shot." She goes, "I know. We can't say anything." I went, "Okay." So there's the fourth dozen. And then he gets another one, a fifth dozen. I said, "I'm not feeling good about this." And she goes, "I know. I know." So fifth dozen, and all of a sudden he goes for a sixth dozen. I went, "You know, I don't think this is going to end well." And there we go, sixth dozen, and he turns for a seventh. I went, "I cannot look. This is not going to be good." And he gives Beau the seventh dozen. Beau takes it and chews it up. And all of a sudden, it all comes out of his mouth, and it looks like he's thrown up. And they have this on video. I said, "Oh." The Krispy Kreme is not happy. I went, "Wow. I didn't see that coming. If anything, I thought it was coming out the other end."
